There are Two Types of UCSB Classes:

1. Classes with LECTURE Meetings WITHOUT Discussion Sessions. Use Enroll Code for Lecture.
2. Classes with LECTURE Meetings WITH Discussion Sessions. Select **ONE** Discussion Session that fits your schedule and use only that Discussion Session Enroll Code. You will not use a Lecture Enroll Code.

Important Terms to Remember

Cancelled – class is not offered; you cannot enroll in it

Closed – you cannot enroll right now; however you may be able to enroll at a later time

Full – the maximum number of enrollments has been reached; however, some students may withdraw later. You may “crash” the class and try to obtain a space. To “crash”, you go to the first class meeting and ask the professor for permission to attend the class. The professor will let you know if you should:

- Enroll in the class; you will need to obtain necessary signatures OR
- Continue to attend class and ADD your name to a WAIT LIST if an enrolled student drops the class, you may be able to enroll at a later date OR
- Leave the class as there are too many students already enrolled and you will not be able to enroll later

Note: If your name is added to a WAIT LIST and if space becomes available within the first 3 weeks of the quarter, you will be notified to enroll in the class. While waiting, you will need to attend all lecture meetings and keep up with all assignments.

Enrollment in UCSB/Open University classes will be finalized in the third week of the quarter. Therefore, you may need to attend more classes than you desire to enroll in. You may need to attend 8-9 classes (attend every meeting) during the first 2-3 weeks of the quarter.
